PRACTISE: Plural Possession

Pupils can practise what they have learnt in the TEACH section of the resource, completing the activities on the practise worksheets.

How is this resource differentiated?

Three activities are differentiated for three levels of ability.

- Practise sheet 1 – for pupils who may need support. Questions will have a lower cognitive domain (what is being asked of pupils) and/or vocabulary used may be simplified where possible.
- Practise sheet 2 – for pupils working at age related expectations.
- Practise sheet 3 – for pupils who may need an additional challenge once practise sheet 2 has been completed.

Revisit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Revisit how possessive apostrophes are used to show singular and plural possession. ➤ <i>Q – Can you give me examples of when an apostrophe for possession should be used?</i> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Ask pupils to discuss and share their understanding of apostrophes used for possession and collect examples. ➤ Pupils could look in books to find examples. 	
Practise	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Pupils should complete Practise sheet 1, 2 or 2 and 3, showing their understanding of apostrophes for plural possession. ➤ This could be completed independently as part of an English lesson, during guided group work or could be set as a homework task. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Three practise sheets are included. ➤ Practise sheet 1 – for pupils who may need support and are working towards the expected standard for their age. ➤ Practise sheet 2 – for pupils working at age related expectations. ➤ Practise sheet 3 – An extra challenge for pupils who may be working at greater depth in this area. It should be completed once Practise sheet 2 has been completed successfully.
