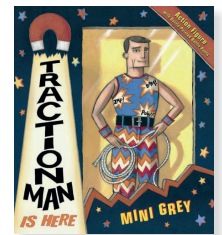
The Bandit Queen by Lauren and O'Hara, published by Puffin

The bandits kidnap a baby and bring her up to be selfish, thoughtless and demanding. When she rejects their ways and goes in search of kindness, responsibility and a regular routine, the bandits are forced to rethink their behaviour. *Picturebook with rhyming text*



Traction Man is Here by Mini Grey, published by Red Fox

Imaginative play with superheroes as Traction Man and his sidekick, Scrubbing Brush, battle villains to make the house a safer place. Is that a poisonous dishcloth creeping up on them? And what will they do about Wicked Professor Spade? *Graphic novel-inspired picturebook*
