Developing deeper subject knowledge:

Unit 4 - How to teach statements, questions, commands and exclamations

Teaching activities to try

- Give children a chopped-up exclamation sentence and ask them to put this back together. Children should justify their answers.
- Give children a list of question words (e.g. who, what, how, why) and ask them to create their own questions.
- Give various children around the class statements, questions, commands or exclamations. Say, 'Who has an exclamation?' The child who answers first wins a point. This can also be completed in small groups with a TA/HLTA.

Planning your next steps

Are statements being taught explicitly in year 1? (Not just capital letters and full stops but how words combine to make a statement, e.g. verb, subject etc.)

Are year 2 teachers ensuring that statements, questions, commands and exclamations are being taught explicitly to children?

Are KS2 reviewing these 4 sentence types?

- Exclamation
